Meeting called to order at 7:00 pm

...Two of three applicants were present to give the Board a summary of their qualifications and why they were interested in becoming a Board member.

1. Debra Walton, retired and is now interested in helping to facilitate the improvement and creation of safe green spaces for families, currently a member of the Aloha Reedville Citizen Advisory Board.
2. Lisa Potter, small business owner...retired. Would like to help by addressing the needs of the community..outreach and making sure there is sufficient staff to maintain the parks.
3. Bruce Johnson submitted his application however he was not present at this meeting. He sent in his application. His major interests and concerns were listed as..A vital community with long term planning and growth, to establish delegated safe green space use available for all ages.

Dog Park..Sandi Hartley represented the concerns of the future Dog Park. She was concerned that we have not yet had a response from John Mullen from the State Park. She asked what this Board was going to be recommending regarding the location of the Dog Park. Chairman Triewasser responded that no decision has been made at this time until we get some direction from John Mullen. This issue will again be on the Agenda for the June meeting.

Splash Pad Update: Interviews with bidders are scheduled for June 11th and 12th. We have had five responses from bidders. Mark asks for a volunteer from our Board to serve on the interview panel. Barry Johnson volunteers.

Ackerman Project: Mayor Hodson reports that there is a semi-final draft with some changes to park design. Initial price tag around 14 million. 7 million for turf and lights, 7 million for bleachers, restrooms, concession stands, parking. Had a productive meeting with the School Board who do not want to maintain new facility but would want to have

the ability to use the fields if necessary. The District is still not sure what to do with Ackerman School. Mayor says it appears that the community will have to decide if they want to help fund this project.
