

Canby Bike and Pedestrian Committee Meeting
December 14th, 2021

Attendees: Mindy Montecucco, Bruce Parker, Britt Ash, Russ Heinemann, Ron Burn (Guest, Canby Heritage and Landmarks Commission), Cliff Ash, Greg Parker, Jamie Stickel

Called to order at 6:34 pm

New Business/Updates:

Brooke Toma (Canby citizen) attended 1st part of meeting. Voiced concern over the safety of road crossings in the area of Baker Prairie School, specifically Township and the driveway area near Teakwood.

- Greg suggests our BP committee puts this before the Canby City Council, with the idea that the city could hire a consultant to assess the safety and propose solutions. Bruce put forward a motion to allow Greg to put this before the council on our behalf, motion was unanimously approved.

Update from Greg: He'll forward the Hwy 99 rebuild plan to the committee. Projected project completion end of 2022.

- Ivy getting sidewalks and underground utilities.
- Additional funds available, which could be used for a pathway from the Logging Road bridge to Fred Meyer complex, along with cosmetic improvements to the bridge.
- The new metal arch at Grant and 1st is being placed.
- When City Council can do in-person meetings, they plan to keep a remote option, which should help increase participation.

Update from Jamie: N. Redwood will include 2 car lanes, and a bike lane, as Redwood continues to be built up. The Traffic Safety Committee is likely to support any of our recommendations. Public Works will work on Eco Park side of Territorial, with a 4-way stop. Locust will also have a sidewalk on one side, and parking on the other, in a certain stretch of the road.

- Cliff would like crosswalks on 10th and Holly, and more sidewalks. He made a motion for the committee to bring this to the city council, Bruce 2nd the motion, and Mindy will take it to the City Council.

County Update from Bruce/Santa Claus: The county prioritized 3 projects with LED crosswalks in different parts of Clackamas County, and more bike lanes in Milwaukie. They are also planning to improve the I-205/43 intersection.

Old Business

- Jamie reports that the meeting with Dan Miller of the Nat'l Park Service is set.
- Re: restrooms at the Eco Park, Greg reports the future Dog Park could share a restroom with the Eco Park.
- Bruce attempted to voice to Parks and Rec that restrooms at Eco Park should be a priority, and will discuss it when the master plan is available. To make sure this is a priority, Mindy will let the

council know Eco Park restrooms should be a priority, and that we have concerns about communication between our committee and Parks and Rec, and suggest that public comment be part of the Parks and Rec agenda.

–Per Bruce, Parks and Rec got 12,000-14,000 responses to the Master Plan survey. He also notes that Canby's development fees are higher than comparable cities.

–Per Greg, the city is trying to find a solution to the issue of sidewalks being limited to the side of the road which is developed, as properties are annexed into the city.
