One Mayoral Candidate and Seven City Council Candidates File for November Election

Canby has three open seats for City Council and one seat for Mayor.

On Tuesday, August 30<sup>th</sup>, the Canby City Recorder submitted the certified list of City Council and Mayoral candidates to Clackamas County for November 8<sup>th</sup>, 2022 general election.

The City of Canby has three City Council seats open for this election, all of which are four-year terms. The City received seven nominations which include Brad Clark, James X. Davis, Craig Lewelling, Herman Maldonado, Art Marine, Greg Parker, and Shawn Varwig. Canby residents will vote in November and the three candidates receiving the highest number of votes will serve as City Councilors.

The Mayor's seat is a two-year term. Brian Hodson, who has served as the Mayor of Canby since 2013, was the sole applicant for the Mayor's seat.

Canby's City Council is comprised of the Mayor and six City Councilors. The City Council meets regularly on the first and third Wednesday of the month. Qualified applicants must have been a resident of the city of Canby for the twelve months immediately preceding the appointment and must collect 50 signatures from registered Canby voters to be included on the ballot. Furthermore, applicants are required to be a current, registered Oregon voter.
