Past Canby Plans & Vision and Successes

- Canby has done extensive planning over the years in specific areas
 - (Downtown Plan, Transportation Systems Plan, Parks Plan, Urban Renewal Plan, Main street Vision, etc.)
- No overall community planning has occurred since the Comprehensive Plan was adopted in 1984
- There has never been an overall Canby Vision
- Past Community Successes:
 - Downtown 1st and 2nd Avenue Street Improvements, Canby Pioneer Industrial Park, Vietnam and 9/11 Memorials, new parks and trails, Local street utility fee and gas tax to fund road improvements, CAT, new design standards, attractive gateway signs, and the Canby Main street Program.

Canby Vision Process

- Kick off meeting September 25th 100 community members attended.
 - O Community members generated ideas on what they valued and identified gaps. Attendees formed small groups, wrote their ideas on notes, discussed them and reported back to the whole group.
- Ideas were sorted into 5 general themes
 - Development, Community, Parks and Recreation, Transportation and Public Safety and Small Town Feel.
- Focused Group Discussion Meetings October 15th, 16th 23rd
 - Refined assets and gaps and began developing themes.

December 3, 4, 10 and 11th

- Prioritize gaps and develop ideas for implementation.
- Discussion Draft Vision unveiled January 9th, 2012
- Community Survey conducted from January 9 Feb. 2nd
 - o 60 responses / 36 pages of input was incorporated by facilitators and staff
- Revised Community Vision adoption presentation March 20, 2013



- Public Transportation System that is reliable, frequent, flexible, cost effective and meets the needs of the community




