The meeting was called to order at 5:30 p.m. by Lois Brooks, Chair.

LAB meetings are now on the city calendar for everyone to view.

Canby Herald publicity is going well. There was a recent article on the revived teen Dungeons & Dragons program.

As for the *Cultivating Canby* discussion, some LAB members are still not feeling included on future plannings of the city. Lois proposed we drop the matter for now.

Lois introduced our newly appointed LAB member, Tiffany Mach, who also works with the Friends of the Canby Public Library. She lives in Canby and has children in the Canby school system. Welcome Tiffany!

Finally, Marisa Ely was appointed as the permanent Library Director.

Luke met with librarians at the high school to talk about establishing a formal process of bringing on a new teen liaison to the LAB since he is graduating this year. LAB members should be thinking about questions to ask potential teen liaison candidates. Applications will be due

March 1st. Questions to think about: What are we looking for in a teen liaison? Do we want a pool of applicants or one applicant the librarians recommend? How can we make this opportunity carry more weight so teens apply? LAB agreed to have the librarians narrow it down to three teen applicants and LAB will interview them. LAB will work on creating a WIFM document (*What's in it for me?*). Luke will continue working on the process with the school librarians and he will bring a draft document to the next LAB meeting.

Friends of the Library Report.

A recent funding request by library staff for Maker Lab items (\$5,000) and a seed library (\$600) was recently approved.

The Canby Reads 2024 program is also being funded by FOL. This year's book is *Klara and the Sun* by Kazuo Ishiguro, and 100 copies will be available on February 14th.

The FOL Annual meeting was held on January 24th.

Discussion Items

Report to City Council.

This will be tabled for now.

Goal Setting & To-Do List.

The City Council will be having a goal setting session in February. Marisa will create a document of the library and LAB's goals that we can share with City Council, and Lois and LAB will review it.

Shifting Library Hours.

Due to a community ask, the library wants to shift open hours in order to stay open a little later Monday through Thursday. A city-wide community survey will hopefully happen in the next few years to get more information on what the community wants and needs, but until then, library staff and LAB have agreed that shifting hours is the best choice for now. Due to staffing and budget constraints, this conversation is about shifting hours, not extending hours. The suggested new hours are Monday through Thursday, 10am-7pm and Friday/Saturday 10am-5pm. Rick made a motion to approve of these new hours. Jen seconded. All in favor. Opposed: None.

Donation Process/Policy.

Kristi came up with a donation policy draft (see attachment). We want to make sure the policy addresses in-kind donations (like paintings etc.). We want to discourage donations with stipulations. If we agree to accept in-kind donations, it must be clear that those items are then

the property of FOL or Foundation to do what they will. For all other items, we can point people to donate to the Kiwanis thrift store.

Action Items

- LAB will work on a WIFM (What's In It For Me?) document for future teen liaisons and Luke will bring a draft of the process document to the next meeting.
- Marisa will create a document of the library and LAB's goals that we can share with City Council, and Lois and LAB will review it.
- Kristi will continue to work on the donation process/policy document.

There being no other concerns, reports or questions, the meeting adjourned at 6:37 p.m. The next meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, February 20, 2024, at 5:30 p.m. in the Council Chambers or via Zoom.



 Both the Children's World Language and Holiday books were moved to their own unit between the Juvenile DVDs/Blu-rays and Early Reader collections.




[Pictured: (Left) Children's World Language & Holiday books in their new location; (Right) World Language collection]
