








#### Canby Adult Fitness Participation




Q: How well does the City communicate with you about parks & recreation? by "Source"

# Preferred Communication Methods – Overall Population and Hispanic Population




### Canby Residents Funding Preferences to Pay for Long-Term Improvements

Q: What do you think are the best ways to pay for long-term improvements for parks and recreation facilities? by "Registered Voter"




#### Support For Swim Center and Maintenance Fees

## The Canby System





### Canby Inventory Site Visits

- Continue to update to consistent signage across the system for park ID signs, trails and bike system
- System lacks a dog park
- Reliance on schools to supplement service especially in terms of sports fields/courts
- Canby does have some options for future sports complex
- City should hold to standards for benches, shelters, etc.,
- Perform ADA transition plan and maintain accessibility within parks
- Need for a playground replacement schedule
- Ensure new development is providing walkable access to a neighborhood park




### Pedestrian Zones




Walkable Access Example






# Who has Walkable Access?




#### % of Population with Walkable Access to Outdoor Recreation




